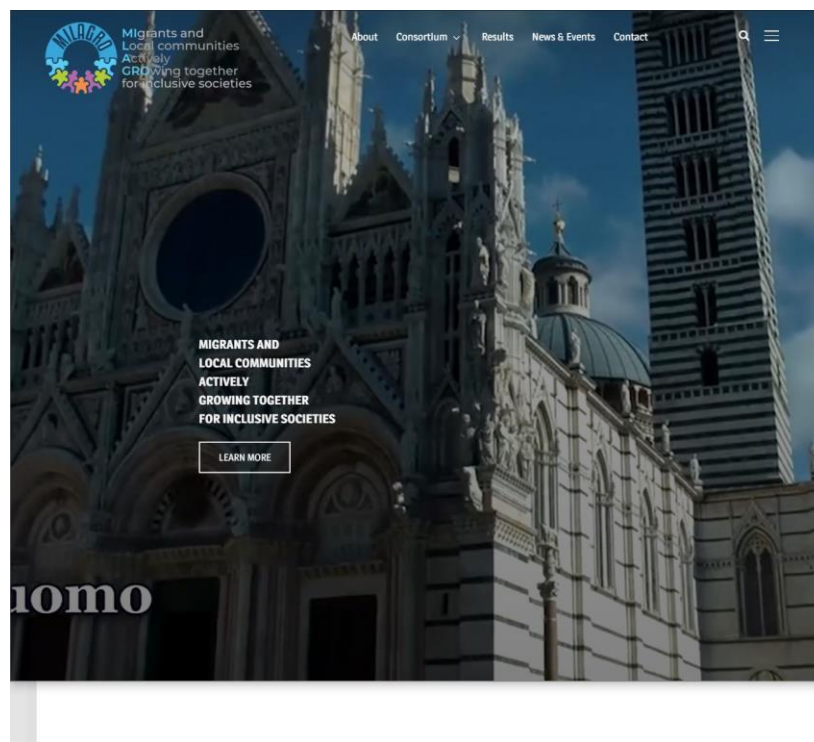

The first page of the site is dominated by a video clip composed of striking sequences from online sources recordings of the host cities where the project is implemented.

The recognizable logo of the project is typically placed in the upper left corner, while in the upper right corner is the main menu in which the categories *About*, *Consortium*, *Results*, *News & Events* and *Contact*




The Consortium category also functions as a drop-down menu with subcategories:



From personalized pages with descriptions of partner institutions can be further accessed through partner logos and appropriate links of official internet presentations of the institutions that make up the consortium formed around the MILAGRO project.


The site is optimized for mobile phones and the content on it is organized so that it is in front of the user opens by scrolling from top to bottom as a scrollable data gallery, which is something typical and specific for the Internet era in which we are, where a large number of users can use exactly the same way of scrolling through the contents of social networks on their phones.

In the continuation of the front page, by scrolling down, a section with more current news opens, from where one can access special pages with brief information about the event and accompanying galleries, organized in an overview gallery.
